## WHITE

**2022 Miners Ridge Chardonnay, Armstrong Grampians \$45**

*A modern example of Chardonnay, with a balanced use of oak ageing to provide creaminess and texture, without becoming overly buttery or heavy.*

**2020 House of Muck Riesling, Ararat, Grampians \$50**

*From a 40 year old Riesling vineyard, this is a fantastic example of the Grampians style. Hints of tropical fruit on the nose and a beautiful balance of ripe fruit and a crisp citrus finish.*

**2016 ATR Wines 'Chockstone' Museum Release Riesling, Armstrong, Grampians \$55**

*A fantastic example of how well Riesling ages. This is showing the early signs of development with a richer and fuller texture, spice and ripe lime aromas, and plenty of acidity to keep the wine fresh and dry.*

**2021 SubRosa Viognier, Buangor, Grampians \$65**

*A side-project from the head winemaker at Mount Langi Ghiran, the SubRosa Viognier has rapidly become one of the best and most interesting white wines in the area. Aged in new French oak, it has a full bodied and luscious style with notes of stone fruits and white flowers.*

# WINES

## RED

### **2019 Jimmy Victorian Pinot Noir, Grampians \$45**

*Displays lovely aromas of red cherry and strawberry fruits on the nose with a hint of light smokiness. A fresh array of cherries, plums and rounded sweetness on the palate, we think this easy drinking wine is a perfect example of what makes pinot noir so attractive. Ideal with a Moroccan spiced warm lamb salad.*

### **2021 The Story Wines Grenache, Great Western, Grampians \$50**

*Grenache has rapidly become the best grape for lighter reds in the region and this is consistently one of the best. Red and black berry driven nose, medium bodied and low in tannin make this a very approachable style.*

### **2019 Fallen Giants Cabernet Sauvignon, Halls Gap, Grampians \$50**

*This vineyard was planted in 1969 but has seen several different owners and names over the years. The Drummond family have run it organically since 2013 and have raised the standards*

### **2019 Best's Great Western 'LSV' Shiraz, Great Western Grampians \$55**

*This is a single-site wine with fruit coming from the Ludvigsen Vineyard and one of the best value wines made at this historic winery. They add in a 'little splash of Viognier' into the Shiraz to give it a lifted aromatic character, whilst maintaining intense dark fruit notes.*

### **2019 SubRosa Nebbiolo, Landsborough, Pyrenees \$65**

*Adam Louder sources the Nebbiolo grapes for this wine from the famed Malakoff Vineyard, home to some of the best grapes in the area. This is a great varietal representation, medium bodied with black cherry and sweet spice notes and a typical dry and savoury finish.*

### **2016 ATR Wines 'Hard Hill Road' Museum Release Durif, Grampians \$75**

*The only Durif vines in the region, this is a rich and opulent wine. Due to the region being cooler than Rutherglen the style is more elegant and not quite as full-on. Ripe black fruits, some savoury notes and a soft finish.*



# WINES

## **2016 Clayfield 'Black Label' Shiraz, Moyston, Grampians \$80**

*Former winemaker at Best's Great Western, Simon Clayfield has established his own vineyard in Moyston and a reputation for some of the best fuller-bodied Shiraz in the region. Dark and powerful with plum and blackcurrant sitting alongside pepper and meaty notes.*

## **2017 Streeton Reserve Shiraz, Grampians \$130**

*By far the most elegant wine in the stable, this is a taut mainline of pepper grind acidity towing scents of iodine, blueberry and mace long and far down the throat. The oak is impeccably nestled into the fold. An impressive wine. Again, indelibly marked with the potpourri of spice and eucalyptus of the Grampians. Detailed, vinous and fine.*

## **2017 St Ethels 1878 Vines Shiraz, Grampians \$225**

*The 2017 St Ethels 1878 Vines Shiraz was chosen as one of the 12 Shiraz wines chosen by Huon Hooke to represent Australia in the Global Wine Challenge held last December. Only 350 bottles are made in the years when there are sufficient grapes to fill one barrique barrel from the half acres of 1878 vines. Deep red colour with a tint of purple at the rim, the bouquet plummy with a lift of mint and a little blackberry. It's medium to full-bodied and soft-textured, with very fine balance and a richness that creeps up on you.*

## **2013 Bin No. 0 Shiraz, Great Western, Grampians \$250**

*Opaque black purple colour with a bright dark purple hue. Scented aromas of liquorice, blackberry and dark plum overlay meaty characters, toasty vanillin cedar and light earthiness with subtle black pepper notes. Medium bodied with excellent richness, yet elegant and beautifully textured the palate features mouth filling flavours of liquorice, blackberry and dark plum followed by vanillin cedar, a subtle meatiness and spice.*

## **1976 Bests Hermitage, Great Western Grampians \$650**

*Maturation was predominantly in century old casks, with approximately 20% American oak, for approximately 2 years. Deep red, amber on edges. Clean and still fresh, complex. Preserved Cherry and dried fruits, with tertiary notes of earth and leather. Soft satin like. Surprisingly fresh for a wine of this age. The front palate contains red fruits of plum and cherry, some dried fruits/jam notes showing through.*
